The model and visuals below show how a provider ultimately collects \$124 for a \$200 billed amount when paid via insurance reimbursement. The second slide explains how, with Sesame, providers are able to collect 25% more (or \$156 in the example) per service.

The average practice collects a maximum of 62 cents on the dollar from insurers.

And this doesn't account for the added administrative cost of claims submission and processing!

Using these figures, one would calculate a 40% gap between average charged amount and average paid amount. As noted, we've chosen to use half that figure for a more conservative estimate.


Administrative denials from insurers: \$-30
