Important Reminders

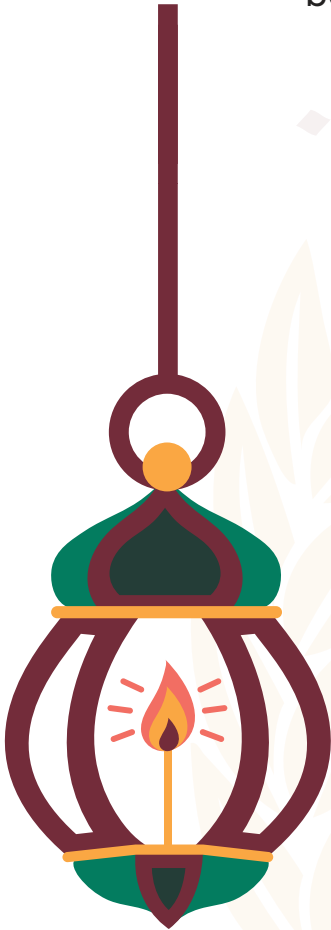
- As per the Gate signs, the official gate closing time for gates 1 & 4 is 8:35am. After 8:35am parents/carers dropping off their children can do so only at Gate 3 (located near the Administration Building) where students will need to obtain a late pass before going to class.
- School attendance and being at school on time is of utmost importance. Students are expected to be at the College by 8:35am and on time for homeroom. During homeroom, students will start the day with reciting the morning dua, Quran recitation and important announcements for the day and the week.
- Please ensure that you inform the College or update your details on the Parent Portal if your personal details have changed, such as emergency contact numbers, phone numbers, address, etc.
- Parents must advise the College of any medical conditions their child may have, whether it is severe or just a mild condition.
- The College cannot provide medication to students unless it has been prescribed to them. This includes hay fever tablets and paracetamol. If your child requires medication your child's name and directions must be on the label before handing any medication to the College nurse.
- The uniform for Term 2 & 3 is the winter uniform. All students are expected to wear the winter uniform, this includes the dark grey winter skirt or tunic and dark grey leggings/tights.
- Please note that the College is currently in the process of transitioning to a new Parent Portal under the name "Seqta Engage". As such, please note that not all functions of the current parent portal are operational.
- A reminder that parents are not allowed on the school grounds. Students to be dropped off at any one of the three school gates.

This term our Year 6 cohort embarked on their annual Canberra Camp.

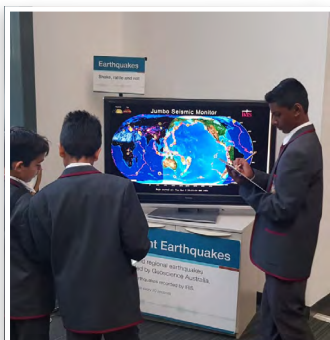

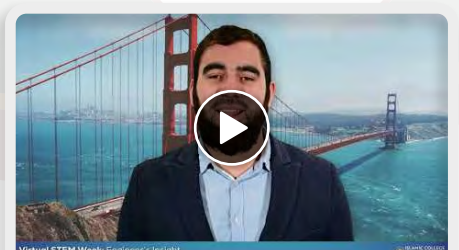

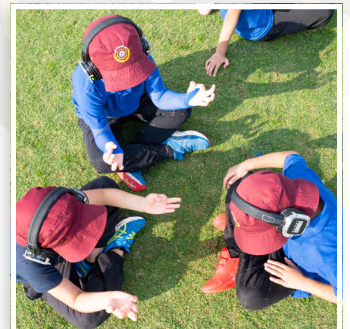

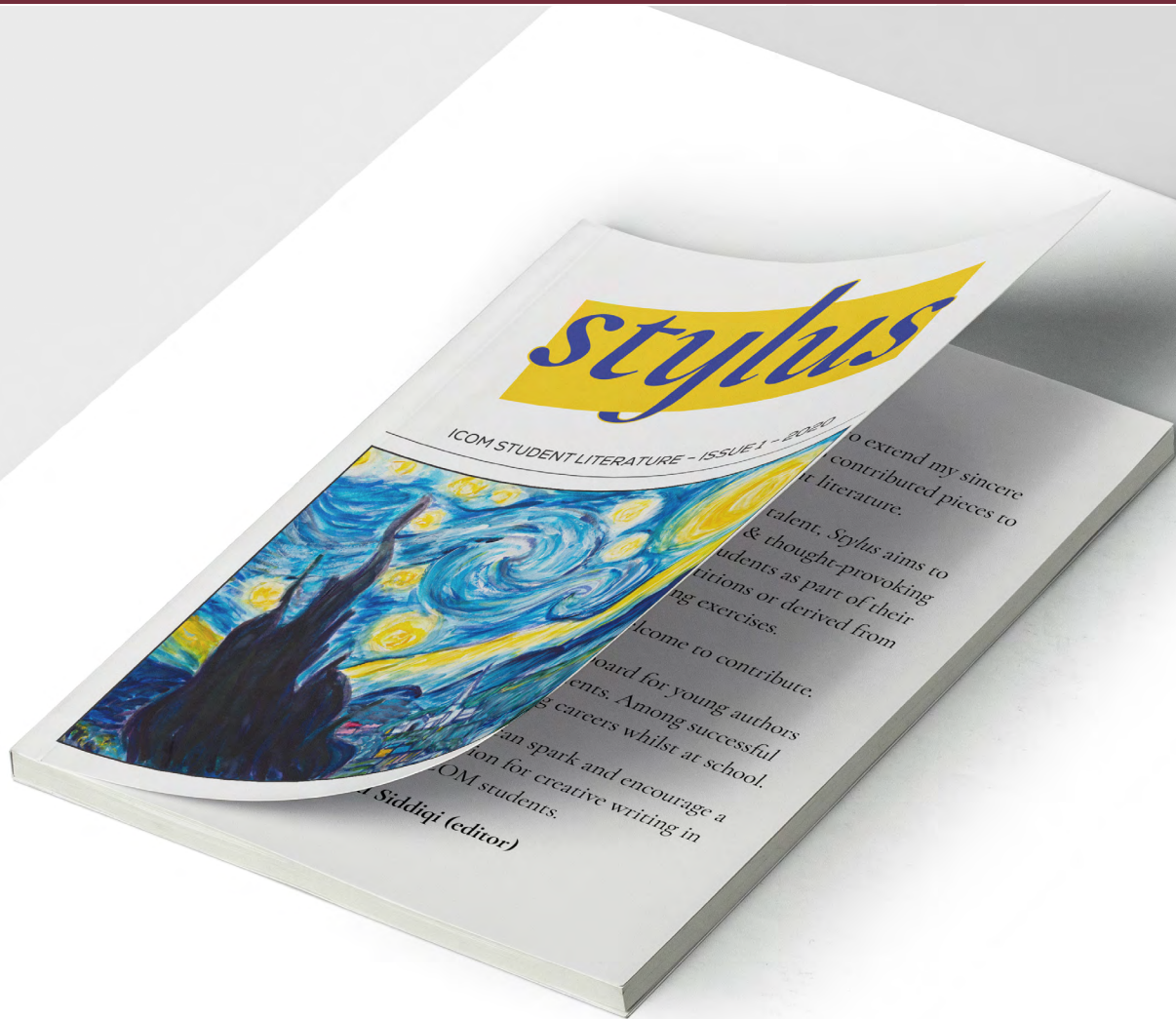

What are eMemberships?

How do eMemberships work?

Once your child has completed the sign-up process, their membership number and password will provide access to the Library's online resources. This eMembership will be valid for one year.

The school will assist students in signing up online for eMemberships, Wyndham City Library staff will be providing step by step guidelines showing you how to sign up and use our online resources.

How can my child receive a full Library membership and Library card?
