

- A very important reminder that all students must arrive to school by 8:35 am. Students arriving after 8:35 am must proceed to gate 3 near the administration building to obtain a late pass. - A reminder that in Term 2 and Term 3, students are to wear the winter uniform, this include the dark grey and maroon winter tunic/skirt.




ICOM Library News

What are eMemberships?

How do eMemberships work?

Once your child has completed the sign-up process, their membership number and password will provide access to the Library's online resources. This eMembership will be valid for one year.



















